Notes: England is quartered centred on Birmingham. North West includes the Isle of Man; South West includes the Channel Islands; Scotland includes Orkney and Shetland; Germany includes Heligoland; Other European includes Belgium, Denmark, Finland, France, Italy, and Russia; Other Countries includes Australia, Egypt, India, Mauritius, New Zealand, and West Indies. Officers includes masters, mates, doctors, engineers; Petty Officers includes carpenters, sailmakers, bosuns, donkeymen, senior or sole cooks, and stewards; Ratings includes ABs, OS, boys, apprentices, firemen, trimmers, other catering and steward crew. Of missing birthplaces 20 of the 23 were apprentices as this data was not normally recorded for them in AACs. Numbers of shipmates are numbers of names appearing on the AACs and include a small number of seafarers entered more than once owing to appearing on more than one of Conrad's AACs.
